## Clark County TV to Air Vegas PBS Special: `#VegasStrong: The Road Ahead' Starting May 2

In cooperation with Vegas PBS Channel 10, Clark County Television will begin airing in May the half-hour special "#VegasStrong: The Road Ahead."

The PBS program explores the resources available for victims of 1 October and the challenges our community faces in coping with the aftermath of the shooting. The special will debut on CCTV at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 2. It will be repeated on Thursday at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m., and other times during the month. A weekly schedule of showtimes is available on Clark County's website at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov. Clark County established the Vegas Strong Resiliency Center with community partners to serve as a one-stop resource and referral hub for anyone struggling with effects from the shooting. Concert-goers, family members of victims, and local residents and bystanders who tried to assist victims are all urged to reach out the resiliency center to learn about available resources. Interviewees in the program include Clark County Assistant County Manager Kevin Schiller, who oversees the center, and representatives from different agencies offering services there including the Nevada Victims of Crime Program, the Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada, and a local therapist who has been working with clients since the immediate hours after the incident. The resiliency center's website at www.VegasStrongRC.org is a key resource for learning about available services. The center is located at 1524 Pinto Lane, 89106. Hours are 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. A group of local survivors of the Route 91 festival shooting worked with Clark County to produce TV and radio public service announcements about the resiliency center and to educate survivors everywhere of a pending deadline to sign up for assistance through the Nevada Victims of Crime Program. Applications for the program are due within one year of the date of the incident, or by Oct. 1, 2018. The program will reimburse victims of the shooting for out-of-pocket expenses resulting from the crime such as medical bills and mental health counseling not covered by insurance. An application for the Victims of Crime Program is posted on the resiliency center's website. CCTV is available in the Las Vegas area on Channel 4/1004 on Cox cable and on CenturyLink on Channels 4 and 1004 as well as in Laughlin on Channel 14 via Suddenlink. Live streaming of CCTV programming is available on the county's website and at www.YouTube.com/ClarkCountyNV. CCTV is also available in Boulder City on Channel 4 and in Moapa Valley on Digital Channel 50.3.
